



A GRANT PUT TO WORK IN THE COMMUNITY

The Tipping Point Emergency Relief Fund Grant

A \$650,000 GRANT...

In 2017, the Hanna Institute (the Institute), a program of the Hanna Boys Center, received a Tipping Point Emergency Relief Fund (TPERF) grant for **\$650,000** to help those impacted by the 2017 North Bay fires.

...TO PROVIDE TRAININGS AND CONSULTATIONS

Partnering with the International Trauma Center, the Institute offered a series of trainings and personalized consultations on trauma-informed care to help build individual and community resilience in Sonoma County with a special focus on families, women, children, students, and the Latinx population.

...FOR 100 AGENCIES AND 3,600 INDIVIDUALS

The Institute trained agencies (schools, nonprofits, government agencies and health care providers) and individuals on how to recognize and reduce the impact from exposure to traumatic events or chronic toxic stress. The trainings were designed to support the individuals working directly with at-risk populations in Sonoma Valley. Trainings included:

- Basic and Advanced Trauma-Informed Care
- Psychological First Aid
- Skills for Psychological Recovery

...TO HELP COMMUNITIES DEALING WITH TOXIC STRESS

At the time the grant was made, the community was already dealing with the toxic stress related to economic disparity, immigration policy, and inadequate access to services. The 2017 wildfires were a catalyst to reveal the widespread trauma and have unfortunately only intensified with subsequent fires and COVID-19.

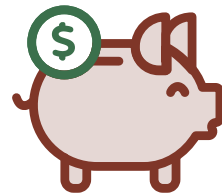
...AND TO HELP PROVIDERS

In the last six months, thanks to the TPERF grant providers have been able to take the lessons learned in 2017 and 2018, and apply them to support the needs of community members experiencing stress and losses from COVID-19, as well as those facing other forms of significant adversity including, homelessness, poverty, and untreated mental illness. The providers have formed collaborations with organizations to help spread the knowledge necessary to support systemic change—and they've changed the landscape for how we, as a community of providers and people, support those who are experiencing toxic stress and the symptoms of depression and anxiety that may come along with it.

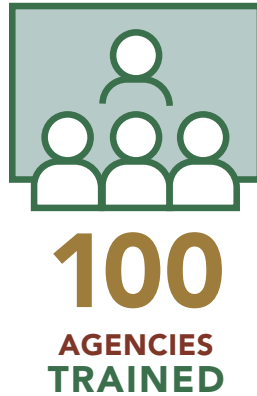
